

A MESSAGE TO COUNTY OF ORANGE RESOURCE FAMILIES Consent for COVID-19 Vaccination for Children in Out-of-Home Placement

The following is an important message from the County of Orange Social Services Agency (SSA) concerning the vaccination of minor dependent children:

Effective immediately, until further notice children 12 years of age and older will be eligible for a COVID-19 vaccination pursuant to the California Department of Social Services All County Information Notice (ACIN) I-42-21. Please refer to the <u>Updated COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Guidelines</u> for details from the California Department of Public Health.

A child in out-of-home placement will not receive a COVID-19 vaccination without parental consent or court authorization. Reasonable efforts will be made to obtain parental consent prior to the child receiving the COVID-19 vaccine.

Resource parents do not have the authority to obtain the COVID-19 vaccination for children placed in their care.

Note: If the Court previously authorized a relative to provide legal consent for a child's medical care using form JV-448 Order Granting Authority to Consent to Medical, Surgical, and Dental Care, then the relative can sign consent for COVID-19 vaccination.

- 1. For children in out-of-home placement, the Assigned Social Worker (ASW) will:
 - Make reasonable efforts to obtain parental consent (verbal consent is acceptable.)
- 2. Advise parents of their right to consent to the child's medical care, unless otherwise restricted by the Court. If a parent refuses/declines to provide consent, Court authorization will not be sought.
- 3. The child is not authorized to sign for their own consent regarding the COVID-19 vaccine.
- 4. For parents who are unable to provide consent on behalf of the child and the child wants to receive the vaccine, court authorization may be requested in consultation with a Supervisor and Program Manager oversight.
- 5. Per SSA's Children and Family Services policy, Court authorization for a child to be given the COVID-19 vaccine may be sought under limited circumstances:
 - Parent(s) are unable to provide consent, and
 - The child wants to receive the COVID-19 vaccine in consultation with SSSS and PM oversight.
- 6. The ASW will notify the caregiver if/when they receive authorization from the parent or the court to provide the vaccine to the child.
